NATIONAL ACTION PLAN

ON THE IMPLEMENTATION IN THE REPUBLIC OF AZERBAIJAN OF UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION 1325 ON WOMEN, PEACE AND SECURITY IN 2020-2023

1. Introduction

Civil population, especially women and children are more affected by armed conflicts which could not be avoided by any country of the world at different periods of human civilization. However, women are unable to enjoy equal participation in security and peace processes. Therefore, on 31 October 2000, the United Nations Security Council (UN Security Council) adopted Resolution 3125, drawing attention to the necessity of women's important role and equal participation in the prevention and management of conflicts and peacebuilding.

Being the first of the eight resolutions adopted by the UN Security Council on the theme of women, peace and security, this Resolution calls upon the Member States to ensure increased representation of women at national, regional and international levels in prevention, management and resolution of conflicts.

Implementation of UN Security Council Resolution 1325 is an important obligation for Azerbaijan, which has been in a state of war since 1988 and a member of the UN since 2 March 1992. As a result of the Armenian-Azerbaijani conflict over Nagorno-Karabakh, Azerbaijan's former Nagorno-Karabakh Autonomous Province and seven adjacent administrative districts were occupied by the armed forces of the Republic of Armenia. As a result of the armed aggression, a total of 6,000 Azerbaijani nationals went missing or were taken prisoner, 20,000 were killed, 100,000 were wounded and subjected to unthinkable torture and abuse, and 50,000 suffered various degrees of injury and became disabled. To this day, 288 women officially registered as missing and 98 as prisoners and hostages are held in Armenia and the occupied territories of Azerbaijan in unbearable conditions, engaged in forced labor and subjected to other forms of violence. Despite the signing of a ceasefire agreement in 1994, killings of Azerbaijani civilians by Armenians are still recorded. During this period, 34 children have been victims of Armenian terrorism. Of them, 14 were killed and 20 were wounded. Currently, 613,129 internally displaced persons (IDPs), including 297,026 men and 316,103 women, are settled in different parts of the country.

The trauma of stress and physical and psychological violence experienced lives with them for a long time, sometimes for a lifetime, which causes serious harm to physical, psychological, social and economic security of people who have gone through war. Furthermore, women and children living in districts bordering the occupied territories have serious health problems, in particular, a number of anomalies are observed in the health of pregnant women and newborns, which has a negative impact on our gene pool. It is crucial to carry out rehabilitation for their reintegration into the family and society, as well as to take action with regard to their right to a dignified and safe life and the right of return. Women play an important role in conflict prevention, management and resolution, peacebuilding and peacekeeping (in particular, as medical and administrative workers). However, their representation and participation in peace negotiations and political decision-making on armed conflicts at national, regional and international levels is almost nonexistent.

Therefore, a series of important steps have been taken in Azerbaijan over the past period in connection with the implementation of UN Security Council Resolution 1325. One of the first and most significant initiatives was the establishment of Coalition 1325, which operated from 2002 to 2006, with the support of UNIFEM. This Coalition implemented important projects in the country for 4 years, bringing together 24 women who represented Milli Majlis (National Parliament), state agencies, non-governmental organizations, political parties and mass media outlets. In addition, in the last 15 years, state agencies, international organizations and national NGOs have implemented dozens of projects and have consistently taken hundreds of appropriate measures on the theme of Women, Peace and Security. Specifically, in the field of social protection of refugee and internally displaced women, which is a matter of constant attention for the state, a legal framework has been established that meets international standards, central coordination of the activities of international and local organizations has been ensured and a favorable environment for cooperation has been created. The Cabinet of Ministers has been instructed to develop and implement an appropriate program for the purposes of development of proposals for strengthening social protection of refugee and internally displaced women in accordance with the 14 January 1998 Order of the President of the Republic of Azerbaijan on "Measures to increase the role of women in Azerbaijan" and providing employment for refugee and internally displaced women in accordance with the 6 March 2000 Decree on implementation of the state policy on women in the Republic of Azerbaijan. By the 26 September 2000 Decision of the Cabinet of Ministers, the Program on Providing Decent Work for Refugee and Internally Displaced Women was approved in order to provide employment for refugee and internally displaced women. On 1 July 2004, the State Program to Improve Living Conditions and Increase Employment of Refugees and IDPs was approved and the Additions made to this State Program under the 31 October 2007 Order #2457 and the 21 February 2011 Order #1346 still continue to be successfully implemented. Currently, consistent work is underway to address the social problems of IDPs, improve their housing conditions, and increase their employment rate.

However, it is essential to develop a National Action Plan on UN Security Council Resolution 1325 in order to act in a consistent, sustainable and coordinated manner. For Azerbaijan, as a member of the Council of Europe (CoE), the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe (OSCE), the Conference on Security and Cooperation in Europe (CSCE), the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS), the Organization for Democracy and Economic Development (GUAM) and other regional organizations and a participant of the EU's Neighborhood Policy and Eastern Partnership Programs, the work that has been and will be carried out in the field of Women, Peace and Security is consistent with the millennium goals for the development of a national mechanism for the establishment of gender equality in the country. Specifically, the government of Azerbaijan has undertaken to prepare and implement development programs in accordance with the international standards for gender equality, which is in line with the global framework of sustainable development goals.

Thus, the UN Security Council encourages the Member States to develop a national strategy in accordance with Resolution 1325. Adoption of a National Action Plan incorporating the obligations under Resolution 1325 in the form of specific activities as part of the strategy is in tune with the recommendations of the UN Security Council, as well as the existing international protection mechanisms in the context of women's rights, including the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW).

Currently, almost half of the 193 member countries of the UN (80 countries, according to the information as of 31 March 2019) have adopted a National Action Plan on UN Security Council Resolution 1325. Taking into account that Azerbaijan is still in a state of war, the National Action Plan for 2020-2023 on the Implementation of UN Security Council Resolution 1325 on Women, Peace and Security is adopted.

Drawing from the principles of UN Security Council Resolution 1325 and selected indicators of the Resolution, this document has been developed on four existing areas of focus: a) prevention, b) participation, c) protection, d) relief and recovery.

- a) Prevention: Intervention strategies empowering women should be improved to end violence against women.
- b) <u>Participation:</u> Women should have equal representation with men in conflict prevention, management and resolution at national, regional and international levels.
- c) <u>Protection:</u> Taking into account the special needs of women and girls, they should be treated with dignity in refugee camps and settlements and protected from all forms of discrimination and violence.
- d) Relief and recovery: Gender-responsive relief and recovery efforts should be improved to tackle international crises.

2. Purpose and main objectives of the National Action Plan

- 2.1. The purpose of the National Action Plan is to significantly increase the participation of women and girls in decision-making processes, including conflict prevention and peacebuilding, at local and national levels, as well as to ensure physical, psychological, social and economic security of conflict-affected women and girls and protect their human rights, taking into account their special needs.
- 2.2. The main objectives of the National Action Plan are as follows:
 - 2.2.1. Prevent conflicts, as well as all forms of structural and physical violence against women and girls;
 - 2.2.2. Include women's and girls' interests and increase their participation in processes aimed at prevention, management and resolution of conflicts;
 - 2.2.3. Protect the human rights of conflict-affected women and girls and ensure their physical, psychological, social and economic security;
 - 2.2.4. Take into account the special needs of women and girls during conflict and in post-conflict period.

3. Financing of the National Action Plan

The activities stipulated in the National Action Plan are financed through funds provided in the state budget of the Republic of Azerbaijan for the relevant implementing state agencies for the respective years and other sources not prohibited by law.

4. Expected results of the implementation of the National Action Plan

- 4.1. Expected results of the implementation of the National Action Plan are as follows:
 - 4.1.1. Women's and girls' special needs related to their physical, psychological, social and economic security studied and taken into account during conflict and post-conflict processes;
 - 4.1.2. Women's and girls' awareness of and participation in conflict prevention, management and resolution significantly increased;
 - 4.1.3. Mechanisms for the protection of women's and girls' human rights related to their physical, psychological, social and economic security strengthened;
 - 4.1.4. Dignified and safe life and return of women and girls during conflict and in post-conflict period ensured.
